What is an Individual Education Plan (IEP)?



- IEPs identify a range of supports that will enable the student to learn and participate to achieve success.
- Teachers, parents, services personnel and the student work together to develop the IEP.
- The IEP encourages <u>student voice</u>.
- Students can make decisions about their own learning.
- It should consider "reasonable adjustments".
- Includes strategies and resources required to implement a SMART goal that best supports the student.

What is a SMART goal in an Individual Education Plan (IEP)?

The short-term goals in the IEP should be **SMART**:

- Specific (focus on one thing)
- Measurable (task completed/task incomplete)
- Agreed (teacher and student agree)
- Relevant (part of work being covered in class)
- Time-bound (due on a set date)

Short-term **SMART** goals should lead to the achievement of long-term goals.



An example of a SMART goal could be:

Updating my Maths Summary Book

- By the end of week 2 I will bring my Maths summary book to class each lesson.
- By the end of week 4 I will have pasted in most of the important Area summary notes for the topic: Area.
- By the end of week 6 I will have my summary book up to date with all handouts pasted in.
- By the end of Semester 1 I will have all of the Area summary notes pasted in and I will add my own notes.


