# What is a 'reasonable adjustment'?

## A reasonable adjustment is a modification or a change that will help your child, with a disability, participate in activities, sports, camps, assessment tasks and other tasks, like their peers.

#### **Benefits of 'reasonable adjustments'**

- Your child's disability might affect the way they learn so a 'reasonable adjustment' allows adjustments to be made to meet their learning needs.
- They take into account your child's specific learning needs.
- The support and adjustments made will enable your child to experience success like their peers.
- It enables your child alternative ways to access the same information.
- It allows your child students to access school support services speech, OT, psychologist, visiting teachers.

## **Reasonable adjustments can be included**


- In the classroom.
