## **EXAMPLES OF REASONABLE ADJUSTMENTS**

- Break cards (and a clearly defined procedure about how it is used).
- Headphones.
- Teachers sending power points or lesson info prior to the lesson rather than after.
- Making sure parents are emailed important dates, info about assignments, what the modifications are so it's not reliant on the student to know and understand this.
- Decreasing the amount of homework this is really helpful for students who don't need modification to the standard of work but just can't keep up with the amount.
- Extra supports or not having to do group work.
- Not having to do oral presentations or decreasing the number of people you have to present to.
- Not having more than 1 test/exam per day.
- Support to manage timelines so lots of big projects are not due in at the same time.
- Executive functioning support such as breaking assignments/projects into more manageable steps.
- Asking to see how a student's work is progressing to help keep them on track rather than expecting the student to initiate a request for help.
- Easy procedures to request extensions.
